LITURGY

First Reading: A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Pentecost day came round, the Apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking their own language.

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed them in a loud voice: 'Men of Judaea, and all of you who live in Jerusalem, make no mistake about this, but listen carefully to what I say, Jesus the Nazarene was a man commended to you by God, by the miracles and portents and signs that God worked through him when he was among you, as you know.

This man who was put into your power by the deliberate intention and foreknowledge of God, you took and had crucified by men outside the Law. God raised this man Jesus to life, and all of us are witnesses to that. Now raised to the heights by God's right hand, he has received from the Father the Holy Spirit, who was promised, and what you see and hear is the outpouring of that Spirit.'

R.) Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth.

- 1) Bless the Lord, my soul! Lord God, how great you are. How many are your works, O Lord! The earth is full of your riches. (R.)
- 2) You take back your spirit, they die, returning to the dust from which they came. You send forth your spirit, they are created; and renew the face of the earth. (R.)

Second Reading: A Reading from the first Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

There are a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given to him by the Spirit; another may have the gift of preaching instruction given to him by the same Spirit; and another the gift of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through this one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophesy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, who distributes different gifts to different people just as he chooses.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we are all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Canon reminds the congregation of the gift and call which the Sacrament of Confirmation signifies.

RITE OF CONFIRMATION

PRESENTATION OF CANDIDATES

The teacher(s) presents the candidates for Confirmation. The names of the candidates are called and they stand to renew the promises which their Godparents made for them at Baptism.

Renewal of Baptismal Promises

Canon: Do you reject Satan and all his works and empty promises?

All: I do.

Canon: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of

heaven and earth?

All: I do.

Canon: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin

Mary, was crucified, died and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated

at the right hand of the Father?

All: I do.

Canon: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit and giver of life, who today through the

Sacrament of Confirmation, will be given to you in a special way?

All: I do.



Canon: Do you believe in the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the

forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting?

All: I do.

Canon: (to the congregation) This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church in Christ

Jesus Our Lord which we are proud to profess.

All: Amen.

THE LAYING ON OF HANDS



Canon asks the congregation to join him in praying, that God may send the Holy Spirit on the young people to be confirmed.

Bishop: My dear people,

in Baptism God our Father gave the new birth of eternal life to his chosen sons and daughters.

Let us pray to the Father that He will pour out the Holy Spirit, to strengthen these His sons and daughters with His gifts and anoint them, to be more like Christ the Son of God.

All pray in silence for a short while.

Canon extend their hands over the young people to be confirmed, to call upon God to send the Holy Spirit upon them.

Canon: All powerful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

by water and by the Holy Spirit, You freed your sons and daughters from sin and gave them new life.

Send your Holy Spirit upon them to be their Helper and Guide,

Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding,

the spirit of right judgement and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence.

Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in your presence.

Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Anointing With Chrism

When the young people come forward the Canon makes a sign of the cross with chrism, each saying:

Canon: N Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Response: Amen.

Canon: Peace be with you.

Response: And with your spirit.





During the anointing an appropriate music will be played. After the anointing the Priest washes his hands.

All: Lord graciously hear us.

Reader 6- Roise

God our Father, bless all of us who have received your Holy Spirit in Confirmation. May the same Holy Spirit come alive in our lives so that we can fulfil the commitment we have undertaken through this sacrament. Lord hear us.

All: Lord graciously hear us.

Canon: God our Father, listen to our prayers. May your Holy Spirit always remain with us and help us as we spread your Kingdom here on earth. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.
